You see, I had offered her up my own illness during the previous visit. So we talked quite a bit and I decided I needed to offer her up some joy. So we talked and laughed and cried and I learned so much from Aunt Baby Ann that I never knew and I have NEVER missed a reunion. How could I not know these things?

So you see, I've had all the time in the world to talk and listen but I haven't taken it. But I'm so glad I did this time. By the way, would you like to know how she got the name "Baby Ann?" Well, the Millers, who were friends of Henry & Lauretta, said to Lauretta, "you have so many children. Might we have just this one? Lauretta said of course not but did give the Millers the naming rights. So they named her Elizabeth Ann. And Gilbert Huth, then 13, said, "Well, she'll just be our little "Baby Ann."
