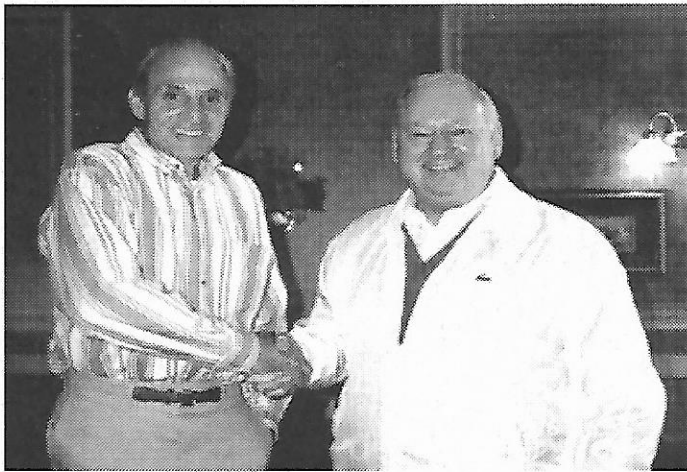
We hope you are proud to be part of this historic evolution. The future depends on what we do today and on how we nurture seeds for growth to flourish.

The Acorn represents another seed planted, giving us pleasure now, as well as documenting family information, that future generations may find valuable in answering their heritage curiosity.

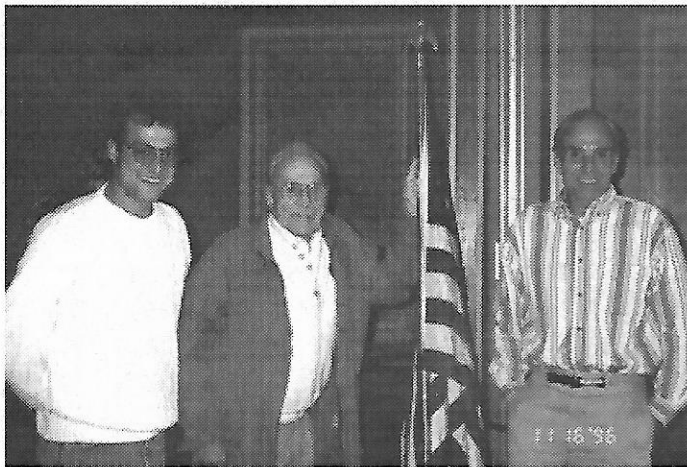
Fall Recap

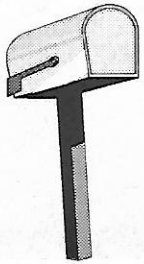

President Dan Huth needs your help to make his communication goal successful. "Let's Talk" provides everyone an opportunity to contribute to this goal.



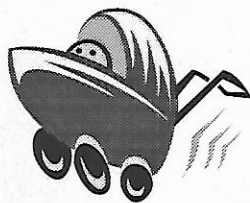

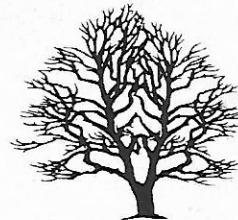
