As is always the case there will be obstacles to overcome, but each and every one of the many details, legal ramifications and governmental regulations will be resolved along the well-lighted path of determination and creative circumstances—this is a Bright Idea that will burn for generations to come in loving memory of the magnificent Henry and Lauretta Huth.
